From the Interim Minister

The next time you see geese heading south for the winter, flying along in a V formation, you might be interested in knowing what science has discovered about why they fly that way....It has been learned that as each bird flaps its wings, it creates an uplift for the bird immediately following. By flying in a V formation, the whole flock adds at least 71% greater flying range than if each bird flew on its own.

Christians who share a common direction and a sense of community can also get where they are going quicker and easier because they are traveling on the thrust and uplift of one another!

Whenever a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the draft and resistance of trying to go it alone, and quickly gets back into formation, to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird immediately in front. If we have as much sense as a goose, we will stay in formation with those who are headed the same way we are going. When the lead goose gets tired, he rotates back in the wing and another goose flies point. It pays to take turns doing hard jobs with people at church or with geese flying south. The geese honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed. What do we say when we honk from behind??

Finally, when a goose gets sick, or is wounded by gun shot and falls out, two geese fall out of formation and follow him down to help and protect him. They stay with him until he is able to fly or until he is dead; and then they launch out on their own with another formation to catch up with their original group.

These geese who helped each other shared. Sharing is both serving and giving. It's a part of our "stewardship." We believe that it is the privilege of the Christian to dedicate what he or she has, what he is, to God. We commonly speak of time, talents and possessions: How we use these is a choice we make which indicates the depth of our faith.

You can share your time by serving in the activities of your church. You can share your talent – your abilities – by answering the call for workers. "Also, you can share your possessions, disciples, of all nations."

You can acknowledge the priority of God's work by giving your time, talent and treasure in the proportion of these gifts God has given you. **



At this time the team is not reading any more profiles.


Our church has come a long way in this process of searching and discerning and we are grateful for your patience and forbearance in this process.

They are especially seeking coffee (ground & instant), hot chocolate, boxes of potatoes, canned pineapple rings, canned corn, carrots, & string beans, brownie & cake mix, and Christmas candy or cookies for the Christmas boxes to be assembled in December. Please be sure nothing has expired - most products are stamped with a "use by" date.

The pantry is also seeking gift cards to Stop&Shop or Shaws to help with meat purchases for Christmas meals. They may be left at the office anytime.

The Angel Tree: SCC's beloved Angel Tree will make its debut in the church foyer on Sunday, December 3. Some of this year's beneficiaries will include 'Christmas in the City', Cohasset Veterans and the Carolina Hill Family Homeless Shelter

Ongoing 'Hurricane Relief' & 'Wildfire Relief': The congregation can continue to partner with the Outreach Committee by contributing to the SCC Hurricane Relief Fund and the SCC Wildfire Relief Fund. Checks can be made out to the church (SCC) with 'Hurricane Relief' or 'Wildfire Relief' noted in the memo line. We appreciate the congregation's heartfelt and generous support of these disaster funds and believe this type of direct giving, when we have a personal connection with an institution, is what our congregation encourages.

Hurricane Relief Fund: We are collecting donations for 'The Abbie School', founded by Cohasset native Abbie White, in Culebra, Puerto Rico. The school suffered severe damage from Hurricane Maria. We have given 'The Abbie School' \$1,000 towards repairing their hurricane damaged school building.

California Wildfire Fund: We are collecting donations for 12 families of the Unitarian Universalist Congregation in Santa Rosa, CA who lost their homes in the Tubbs wildfire. This is Connie Afshar's mother's church in Santa Rosa, CA. When visiting her mother Connie regularly attends this church and can vouch that it's a wonderful, loving and supportive congregation. The church has established a specific "Fire Fund" designated to assist the members of their congregation who lost their homes in the Tubbs wildfire. We have given the Santa Rosa UU Church \$500 towards assisting members of the congregation who lost their homes in the Tubbs Lane wildfire.

Flood Relief: The Outreach Committee gave \$500 to the Salvation Army earlier this fall to assist the flood victims in Texas.


