From the Minister's Study

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. (Romans 12:2)

The church's challenge – for roughly the last 2,000 years – has been to be relevant, to speak to people where they are, to offer a word of hope and a measure of guidance, to be faithful to God and to be courageous in the face of circumstances beyond our control. And, in the midst of all that, to actually be of some help.

Help to whom? Our members, of course. Those struggling in our midst, whether they feel connected or not. Those whose struggles we perceive from a far, near at hand or across the world.

Phew. That's a lot to take on! And yet, we Christians have considered this to be our lot and our call for all of those 2,000 years.

So, in this year, 2020, a year that has promised to become a curse and a cliché, how are we feeling about that?

I, for one, am having a hard time figuring out how to stay relevant, to speak to people where they are, to offer a measure of hope and guidance, to be faithful to God and courageous in these circumstances in a time when hand holding, hugs and even face-to-face engagement is so very out of vogue.

Worship on-line. Sunday School, Confirmation and Youth Group on a screen? Who's prepared for this? Who's receptive to this distanced kind of church?

If you'll allow me a moment of conjecture, I think the answer is "Us."

What an eye-opening moment this has been in the life of the Church and for this church. Across the globe, people of faith have dug deep, pulled hard and reached out. So have we.

When there wasn't a South Shore Arts Festival to support our strawberry shortcake sales, Linda Indek, Linda Campbell, Helene Babiy-Host and a First Parish friend, Dienna Lehner, found a way to serve friends and neighbors and raise over \$10,000 to enable this congregation to keep our ministries strong. Susi Coley transformed her therapeutic art into cards to be used to support the church and encourage others. Crafty Ladies – without clarity about Village Fair plans – are crafting and gearing up for "whatever."

Our youth, tired of Zoom and still remarkably accommodating, jumped at the chance to mask-up and pick up trash on Government Island – part of CLEAN-UP COHASSET on WORLD CLEAN-UP weekend at the end of September. And then showed up for Zoom conversations the following week. And, this last week, in this year of "not like it used to be," it was absolutely wonderful to be part of unloading and laying out Cohasset ASP's annual Pumpkin Patch.

These are not the times we might want. But they are the times that we have. We have a new Confirmation Class and a Youth Group that *wants* to be together in whatever way that is safe. Our children are Zooming together every week to learn and talk about God. Our members are gathering, in-person and on-line, to share joy and concerns and our common commitment to growing in faith and connection. Our outreach to those in the deepest of need is sustained with care and much-needed infusions of cash.

Worship Guidelines

Our goal is to keep you safe while still celebrating our traditions. Our success is based on shared responsibility to each other and, of course, is subject to changing circumstances. Thank you for doing your part.

Wear a mask over your mouth and nose at all times. We'll know you are smiling behind your mask!

Keep your distance. Stay 6' or more apart whenever possible, especially as you enter or leave the sanctuary.

Take advantage of our new hand sanitizer stations and, in using the restroom, please use the supplies provided to prepare for whoever may come next.

If unwell, please stay home! We also live-stream on YouTube. Go to our website to connect: www.2ndcc.org

Dress for the weather We're maximizing ventilation in accordance with <u>CDC guidelines</u> by keeping the windows open.

Fill out the "Welcome" card you received on entering the church. Leave it and the pen in your pew after service. It's easy. It's quick. And it is required by the State of Massachusetts COVID protocols.

Hands-free Offering using the basket as you come in. Donations will be blessed during the service but we will not be passing the plate. Also, consider on-line or mail in giving.

Enjoy the beautiful organ and piano music. There is no choir until we can accommodate them safely. Coffee Hour is also on hold. (Sorry!) Children and youth programs are on-line. See our website for details: www.2ndcc.org

SCC RE-Opening (continued)

The SCC Re-Opening Working Group has also established guidelines for church meetings and small groups who may want to be inperson at the church. Those guidelines will be presented at Church Committee on Tuesday, 10/13, and will be available in full on the church website after that.

In rough summary, Bates Hall is the only available meeting space. As with our worship guidelines, participants must stay distanced and the windows must be open. No food may be served. Masks and hand sanitizing are required and everyone is asked to wipe down surfaces they touch with supplies that are provided.

For in-person church meetings a Zoom option is recommended for committee members who prefer an on-line option. Bates Hall is equipped and technical support is available.

Very importantly, all meetings must be scheduled in advance, with a designated group leader and prompt reporting of meeting participants.

Outreach Sunday (11/22):

Outreach Sunday will be celebrated on Thanksgiving Sunday, November 22. Our honored guest speaker will be Scituate resident, Rich Bonanno, aka "The Bike Man", and founder of the Rolling Wave Foundation. Rich is an amazing guy who has donated over 4,000 bicycles (many personally restored by him) as far afield as a homeless veterans' shelter in Georgia, a Sioux reservation in South Dakota and Haiti. Thanksgiving Sunday (11/22):

Due to the safety protocols of Covid-19, the Cohasset Food Pantry is regrettably unable to receive our traditional annual "Ingathering" of donated food. However, the need is as great or greater than ever so, in lieu of donated food stuffs, the CFP is asking for gift cards to Shaw's and Stop n' Shop supermarkets, enabling our Cohasset friends and neighbors to independently shop for their families' groceries. Please bring your grocery gift cards to church with you on Thanksgiving Sunday.

Wellspring Multi-Service Center Update:

Wellspring Multi-Service Center of Hull, one of the recipients of our church's quarterly donations, is opening a new center in Weymouth this month to begin to help the needy population of a larger area. This new location is 409 Washington St, Weymouth, Route 53, almost opposite the Chair Fair. They are beginning with a Thrift Shop and are in need of donations of clean, seasonal clothing, home goods, and bric-a-brac to sell. They are receiving donations 10a.m. to 3p.m. on Tuesday, Wednesday & Friday, and from 10a.m. to 6p.m. on Thursday and 10a.m.to 12p.m. on Saturday. Since Interfaith Social Services in Quincy is not yet accepting drop-in clothing donations (and this is where our Career Closet goods have always gone), Outreach recommends you take anything you would like to donate directly to this new Wellspring location. Please only give seasonal, clean clothing as their storage space is limited. Once the store is fully operational, Wellspring also plans to begin offering counseling and educational services in Weymouth. Our church wishes them all the best in this new endeavor.

Beirut Disaster Relief Aid:

Through the month of October the Outreach Committee will continue to match the congregation's donations of up to \$400 towards the organization 'Impact Lebanon'. Our assistance will aid the people of Beirut, Lebanon in their recovery from the massive explosion in Beirut's harbor on August 4.

Outreach's Ongoing Initiatives:

Outreach's regular quarterly donations are continuing to go out. These recipient organizations include Wellspring Multi-service Center, Carolina Hill Family Shelter, DOVE, Interfaith Social Services and the Louis D. Brown Peace Institute. However, due to Covid-19 restrictive protocols, our in-person cooking and serving at Father Bill's has been temporarily suspended. We're donating our monthly budget via check in lieu of our personal presence ... and eagerly look forward to resuming our in-person volunteer activity at Father Bill's when it's deemed safe for both the residents and volunteers.

OVER the EDGE:

On Saturday, October 3rd, Phil Lehr went "Over the Edge," rappelling down 22 stories from the roof of the Hyatt Regency in downtown Boston. This event was a "live" rather than virtual fundraiser in support of the 14,000 athletes of Special Olympics Massachusetts.

Phil participated again, in this his 8th year, as part of Team "Jay's Tall Friends" in honor of Jay Nothnagle. This year he also dedicated his event in memory of athlete Mark Adams of Scituate, uncle of Rob Lehr's wife Christine. Mark passed away unexpectedly September 28th at age 51.


