Thank you to all who came to the October 17 Launch Event for the Capital Campaign. Stunning performances from Soprano Chelsea Basler and Pianist Brendon Schapiro brought a joyous complement to presentations from Phil Lehr, Jeff Nothnagle and Pastor Karen, describing the projects underway and our shared efforts to fund them. Many thanks to Music Director Jin Kim for pulling that remarkable concert together.

And many thanks to so many of you for your early response to this Capital Campaign! With your encouragement and a strong response to pre-launch conversations, the Capital Campaign Steering Committee was able to announce that **Second Congregational Church is now working to raise the NEXT \$100,000 toward the critical projects already defined**. Trustees have prioritized those efforts AND hope to continue with needed next steps should we be able to exceed the campaign's original \$200,000 target.

Friends, we all know that there is a range of financial ability represented in this church. That is WHY we're reaching both into and outside of the congregation to raise the money we need. Haiti Earthquake/Hurricane Relief

With generous donations from the congregation and additional funds from the Outreach budget, we sent more than \$1000 to the United Church of Christ national program operating through Wider Church Ministries and Global H.O.P.E to support efforts on the ground in Haiti. Their focus is on immediate relief with water, food and medical supplies, and then help to rebuild housing in the devastated areas. We are hopeful that our donations combined with those of many other churches in the conference, will help the mission effort already established there to serve the people who most need it.

One of Pastor Karen's fellow trustees at Hartford International University (formerly Hartford Seminary) is in Haiti, where he has family, helping with the recovery efforts. In light of the recent events putting missionaries in danger, please keep Amos Lys, his fellow workers, and all the people pf Haiti in your prayers.

Outreach Sunday November 22, 2021 Our guest speaker will be Rich Bonanno of the Rolling Wave Foundation in Scituate. Rich has been featured in the Mariner and on Chronicle for his efforts in collecting donations of everything from food, clothing, toys, and most especially bicycles to ship around the country to families in need. He does it on a very small budget and with lots of in-kind support for local citizens. This fall he is focused

on collecting winter coats, hats, gloves, and boots, new or gently used. for children in grades K to 5. If you can help, donations can be left in the church office or delivered to his home 109 Hollett St, Scituate.
